FINAL APPLICATION OF PROFESSOR GEOFFREY MILLER

1. My name is Geoffrey Miller. I am the Stuyvesant Comfort Professor of Law at New York University Law School. A copy of my resume is attached as Exhibit A.

2. I provided consulting services to the equity committee of Adelphia in February and March of 2003. The work involved an intensive review of Adelphia's unliquidated litigation claims and an attempt to provide a realistic appraisal of their value, under enormous time pressure. This work constituted a central part of the equity committee's activities, since the value (if any) of the equity remaining in Adelphia depended heavily on whether recoveries in litigation could cover Adelphia's otherwise-unpaid debt obligations. A copy of my time record, with explanation of activities rendered, is attached as Exhibit B. Exhibit B contains a narrative discussion of the reasonableness factors outlined in the Final Compensation Procedures.


3. My statement for services was reviewed by Legal Cost Control early in 2004. I provided a detailed explanation of the services rendered and the rationale for my activities in a memorandum dated February 20, 2004, attached as Exhibit C.

4. With my consent, the Fee Committee reduced my fee by \$6,237.00. Certain sums were also held back pending Adelphia's exit from bankruptcy. See Exhibit D. Exhibit D contains a chart detailing the fee and expense reductions required under the Final Compensation Procedures.
